
Welcome to the second Ongoing Formation for Clergy Newsletter!

DISCOVERY DAY 2: RECUSANT STAFFORDSHIRE

Our next Discovery Day will focus on sites associated with some of the Recusant families whose faith and courage helped to maintain and support Catholic communities in Staffordshire after the Reformation.

We will visit the church of St. John the Baptist in Great Haywood and hear the remarkable story of how the church was moved, stone by stone, from its original site on the Clifford estate at Tixall, when the family moved to Yorkshire, to land given by the Cliffords for this purpose. The resilience, and the generosity, of the Aston and Clifford families were vital to the survival of Catholicism in Staffordshire, and the estate at Tixall was a centre of Catholic life.

We will then visit Swynnerton, where we will have lunch and visit the church of Our Lady of the Assumption. This church was built by the Fitzherbert family (now Lord Stafford), whose family home is Swynnerton Hall. The Fitzherberts were staunch Catholics throughout the Recusant period, losing the original castle on the site for their support of the royalist cause in the Civil War. Members of the family joined religious orders in exile, including the Jesuits, and Lord Stafford was executed on false charges under the Titus Oates Plot, in 1680.


Fraternity of the Recently Ordained - March 2023
